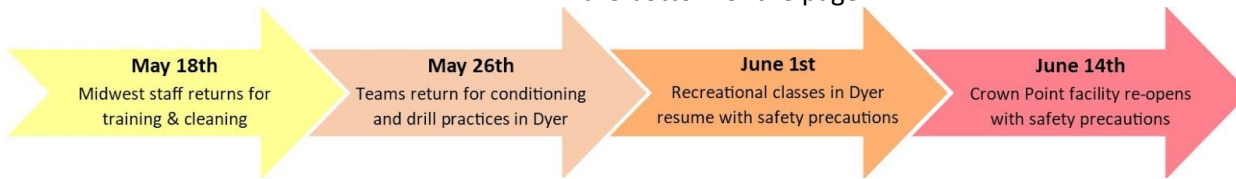


We are excited to announce the reopening of Midwest Training & Ice Center as of May 24th, 2020.

Midwest Training & Ice Center New COVID-19 Main Facility Protocols

We are closely monitoring government policy changes, Centers for Disease Control (CDC) guidelines, government mandates, and public health advancements and will continue to make changes as necessary or appropriate to our protocols and procedures.

We thank you for choosing Midwest Training & Ice for your business. As you are aware, we are facing a unique time and set of circumstances especially now that the World Health Organization has declared the COVID-19 outbreak a pandemic. At Midwest Training, we care deeply about our family of employees and our communities.

Midwest Training suspended all operations starting on, Tuesday, March 17, until further notice. Midwest will be following the lead of the CDC guidelines for the state of Indiana, and U.S. federal guidelines for establishing preventative measures and responding to the pandemic. Midwest Training plans to observe and implement the same restrictions, effective immediately. We will continue to monitor this situation closely and adjust our operations accordingly.

Please pay attention to our social media, website, and emails for any changes or updates.

- Midwest will continue to have the facility deep cleaned and sanitized 7 nights a week using medical grade cleaning supplies.
- Midwest will continue to deep clean and sanitize common areas, high touch areas, and hard surfaces to provide a safe and clean facility.
- In addition, we have ordered and will be providing multiple hand sanitation stations, we will increase employee monitoring of soap dispensers and sanitation stations, and will institute regular shift sanitization of high touch areas around the facility.
- Midwest has begun to clean and repaint high-wear areas around the facility in order to provide the most sanitary environment possible.

Our goal at Midwest is to provide a safe and clean environment for our patrons and staff. Based on current information, we ask that you help by taking the same steps to protect against coronavirus as we take to prevent the spread of everyday illnesses like the common cold or flu:

- Wash your hands often with soap and water for at least 20 seconds;
- If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer with at least 60% alcohol;
- Avoid touching your eyes, nose, and mouth;
- Avoid close contact with people who are sick;
- Stay home if you feel ill;
- Stay home if you or an immediate family member has had contact with anyone who is symptomatic or suspected to be carrying COVID-19;
- Clean and disinfect frequently touched objects and surfaces.

As we continue to determine the best course of action for reopening, other changes you may expect to see include:

- Initially offering individual-based programming with staggered start times, strict participant limits, reduced facility capacity, and limited operating hours
- Reduced program sizes and increased instructor/coach ratios to enforce hygiene protocols
- Increased time between games and practices to facilitate social distancing and cleaning opportunities
- Implementing time restrictions/limits in locker rooms and common areas
- All non-participating guests ages 10 and up will be required to wear a mask applied before entering the facility, and which remains on the wearer's face until having exited
- Absolutely no entrance except through front glass door (one-way traffic using stanchions and/or floor graphics similar to supermarkets)
- We are asking only one parent/caregiver allowed in building for all activities, freestyle, stick times, games, etc.
- Supervised curbside drop-off/pick-up for skaters/players/students age 12 and up, and counselor-led curbside drop-off/pick-up for day campers
- Registration stations in mall hallways with staggered time slots to increase social distancing
- Closure of areas of the building where social distancing is difficult to achieve
- To the extent possible, skaters and players will be asked to dress at home or in the car, and unattended skate bags will be prohibited in the lobby
- Installation of touch-free methodology wherever practicable
- Marked seating and changing stations that adhere to social distancing guidelines in public areas
